

BIBLE TRUTHS ABOUT SALVATION

LESSON ONE

The Bible teaches that we can know for certain that we will go to Heaven when we die. The Bible is God's Word and that means it is the final authority on the subject of salvation, which includes going to Heaven. Jesus said in **Matthew 24:35**, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will by no means pass away." He also stated in **John 12:48**, "The word that I have spoken will judge him in the last day." Jesus' words are the basis for the New Testament. The authority of His statements have remained constant for two thousand years and will continue to do so for eternity. Our beliefs **must** be based on God's Word.

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According to the Jesus' statements in **Matthew 7: 13-14**, will there be more people who enter Heaven or miss Heaven at the end of life?

YOU CAN HAVE ETERNAL LIFE BEFORE YOU DIE.

Please note that each of these verses is in the present tense. Jesus used the present tense to establish that you can have eternal life *right now*.

WE HAVE HOPE OVER SIN.

Thinking honestly through the previous verses about sin could be depressing. However, the first step to a “know-so” salvation is seeing yourself as guilty before a righteous God.
